Engagement from partners and press was great, with the focus on students and the Specialist Emerald Team in Lincolnshire police.

National Ugly Mugs has been successfully promoted in Lincolnshire, including direct contact with 170 online sex workers. Three of those contacted have agreed to support the media work around promoting the scheme and keeping sex workers safe in the county. Positive effects of this promotion are already being seen- in the last 2 months reports in Lincolnshire have increased from 0 to 3.

LCSP Strategic Review

Data collection has been completed and the findings of the four elements below have been collated.

- The legislation around community safety partnerships and best practise for community safety partnerships have been researched.
- A desktop assessment has been carried out of minutes, agendas, attendance, delivery plans, publicity and analytical products.
- Members of the LCSP have been interviewed to ascertain their views of the partnership, its structure, functions and achievements.
- A survey was sent to SMB members, to gather the experiences of members across all the LCSP SMBs- 29 responses were received.

The findings are now being analysed and a report will be presented at the LCSP on November 27th containing the results of the review and recommendations for improvements to the LCSP to ensure it is in the best possible position going into the 2018-2021 priority cycle.

Serious & Organised Crime

SOC SMB has determined 3 priorities for the group and sub-groups are being set up to address each of these. Both the **County Lines** and **Modern Slavery** groups have been established and a group focusing on **Fraud and Cyber/Scams** with a focus on vulnerable victims is currently being set up.

Stay Safe Partnership- Introduction of Multi Agency Days (MAD)

We're really pleased that for this current academic year, we are able to offer every Secondary school two FREE multi agency days which cover the priorities of both the LCSP and the LSCB. The offer for year 7's or 8's are workshops on ASB, Internet Safety, Alcohol Awareness, Healthy Relationships and Fire. The offer for year 9's or 10's are workshops on ASB, Internet Safety, Drugs Awareness, Healthy Relationships and Road Safety.

The aim is that all young people in Lincolnshire receive the correct information to be able to make informed decisions, should they be faced with various situations. All of these workshops will be delivered by local experts and offer follow on material for staff to develop in future lessons.

These days will replace the 'It's that Easy' days where schools had a choice of workshops and most chose workshops based on cost rather than need of students. These days will be FREE for at least this academic year.

The first Reducing Offending Delivery Group meeting took place on Tuesday 17th October 2017 to help drive actions set within our delivery plan.

Substance Misuse

SOC SMB have created a subgroup to focus on **County Lines**- a drug network which infiltrates towns and takes over the supplying of drugs, using one central phone line to distribute. Through this group a presentation has been developed and shared with professionals to raise awareness of the issue and help professionals spot some of the signs that a vulnerable person may have had their home taken over by the gangs or be drug running for the gangs.

Survivor Feedback

There is suspected to be 22,000 individual people in Lincolnshire experiencing domestic abuse at one time, to make things easier for them we want to learn from those who have already experienced domestic abuse.

ASB Case Management

The Anti-Social Behaviour Strategic Management Board (ASB SMB) continue to move forward with the procurement of a new ASB Case Management System. Key stakeholders have been consulted and a final specification has been drafted in preparation for commencing the bidding process.
