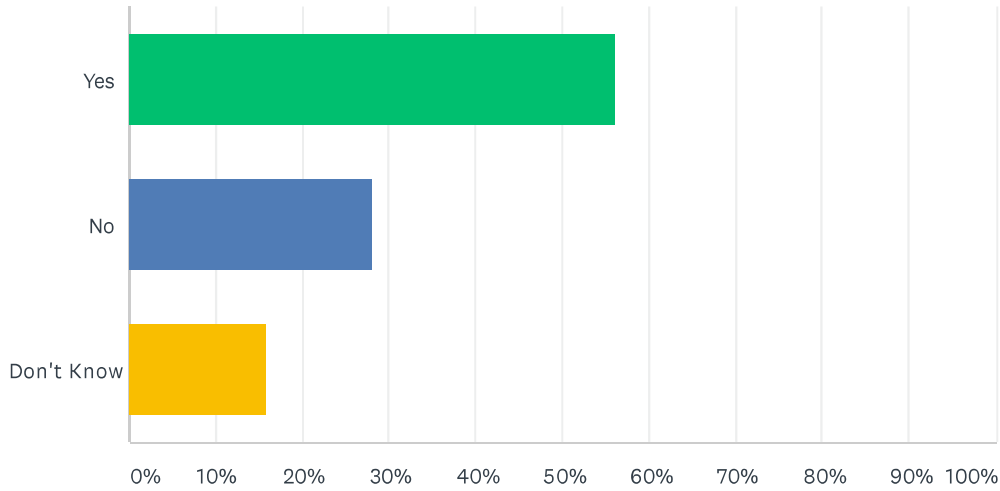


Q1 Do you agree that we should keep the main characteristics of the current Council Tax Support scheme for the next financial year to provide continuity?

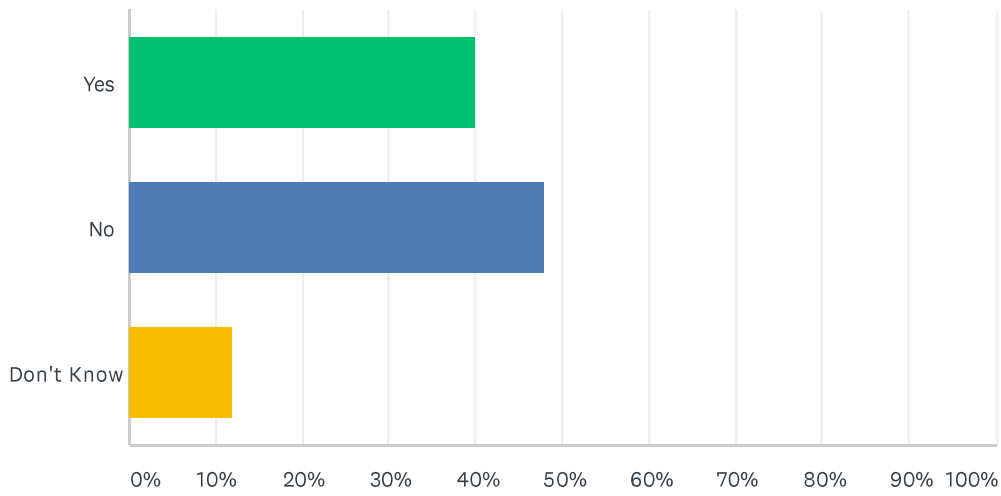

Q2 Do you agree that our current scheme is fair and provides support to those most vulnerable?

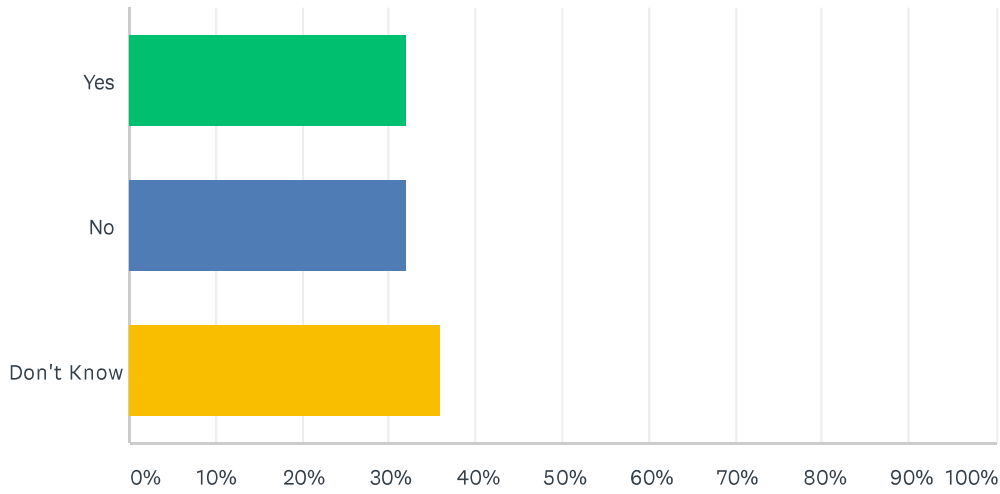

Q3 Are there any other people we should protect when considering changes to our Council Tax Support Scheme in the future?

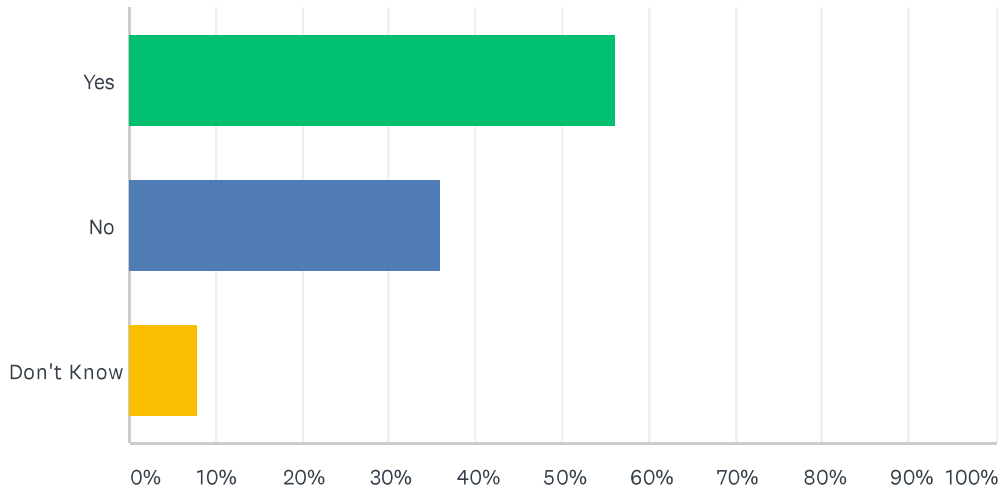

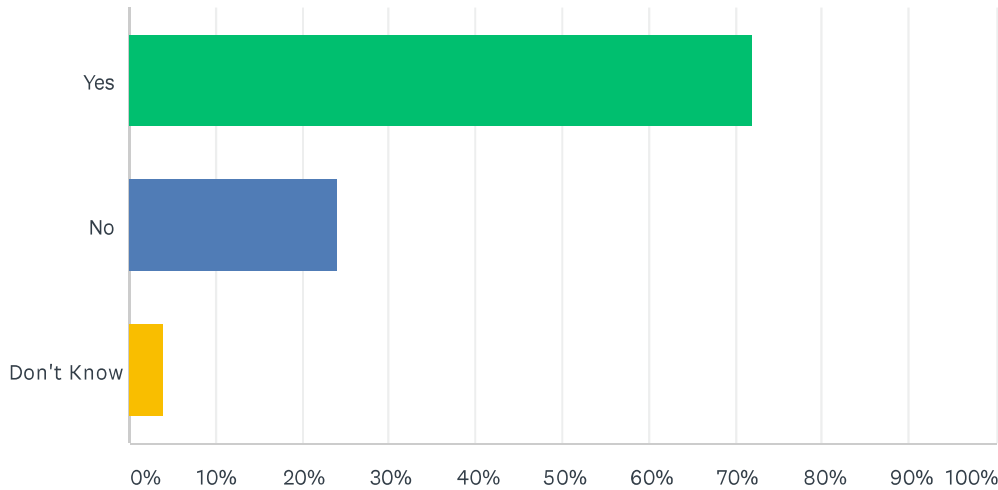
